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Riggleman Smoked in Manipulated Convention, Dems Vow to Invest Millions to Flip VA-05 Red Seat

Presumptive VA-05 GOP nominee Bob Good celebrated a stunning victory early Sunday morning, ousting one-term incumbent Republican U.S. Rep. Denver Riggleman while garnering 58 percent of the “drive-by” convention vote.

Less than 3,000 mobile delegates participated in the nomination knock-out coup, engineered by the infamous conventioneer political consultant duo of Chris and Diana Shores.

They're the new Bonnie and Clyde of Virginia GOP convention politics.

The Shores convention cabal just missed nominating Virginia State Committeewoman Cynthia Dunbar to both the Fifth and Sixth Districts in 2018. This was sweet revenge.

President Trump endorsed Riggleman in the race and suffered his first primary endorsement defeat this cycle.

The margin of Good's victory (58-42) sends a clear warning sign to other VA GOP incumbents that if you don't tow the line of unit chairs in various districts, they can force a convention, manipulate the rules and take you out.

This scenario played out in VA House of Delegates District 97 in 2019, when Scott Wyatt defeated Del. Chris Peace in a similarly shadily orchestrated convention maneuver.

Democrats now see VA-05 as a surprise takeover opportunity. The last Democrat to win the district was Tom Perriello in 2008. He served one term, losing in 2010 to Robert Hurt.

Excerpts from the President's Speech

“In this place more than 200 years ago, American patriots stood their ground and repelled a British invasion in the Battle of Baltimore during the War of 1812. Early on a September morning in 1814, the British fleet launched an assault on this peninsula. From the Harbor, some 30 British warships attack this stronghold. Rockets rained down, bombs burst in the air, and the deck of one ship, a gallant young American was held captive. His name was Francis Scott Key. For 25 hours, Key watched in dismay as fire crashed down upon this ground. But through torrents of rain and smoke and the den of battle, Key could make out 15 broad stripes and 15 bright stars barraged and battered but still there.

American Forces did not waiver. They did not retreat. They stared down the invasion and they held that they had to endure, the fact is they held like nobody could have held before. They held this fort. The British retreated. Independence was saved. Francis Scott Key was so inspired by the sight of our flag in the battle waged that the very grounds that he fought on became hallowed. And he wrote a poem. His ageless words became the anthem of our nation, The Star Spangled Banner.

Every time we sing our anthem, every time it's rousing chorus swells our hearts with pride, we renew the eternal bonds of loyalty to our fallen heroes. We think of the soldiers who spend their final heroic moments on distant battlefields to keep us safe at home. We remember the young Americans who never got the chance to grow old but whose legacy will outlive us all. In every generation, these Intrepid souls kiss goodbye to their families and loved ones. They took flight in plane, set sail in ships, and marched into battle with our flag fighting for our country, defending our people.

When the cause of liberty was in jeopardy, American warriors carried that flag through ice and snow to victory at Trenton. They hoisted it up the mass of great battleships in Manila Bay. They fought through hell to raise it high atop a remote Island in the Pacific Ocean called Iwo Jima. From the Philippine Sea to Fallujah, from New Orleans to Normandy, from Saratoga to Sipan, from the Battle of Baltimore to the Battle of the Bulge, Americans gave their lives to carry that flag through piercing waves, blazing fires, sweltering deserts, and storms of bullets and shrapnel. They climbed atop enemy tanks, jumped out of burning airplanes,

and leaped on live grenades. Their love was boundless. Their devotion was without limit. Their courage was beyond measure.

From generation to generation, heroes like these have poured out their blood and sweat and heart and tears for our country. Because of them, America is strong and safe and mighty and free. Because of them, two centuries on The Star Spangled Banner still proudly waves. For as long as our flag flies in the sky above, the names of these fallen warriors will be woven into its threads. For as long as we have citizens willing to follow their example, to carry on their burden, to continue their legacy, then America's cause will never fail and American freedom will never ever die.”

“Those of us who saw the spectacular and unforgettable liftoff this afternoon watched more than an act of history; we watched an act of heroism. Every time our astronauts climb aboard a rocket — which is many, many stories of only engine and fuel — and vault across the sky, they display breathtaking valor.

What Colonel Douglas Hurley and Colonel Robert Behnken did this afternoon was pure American genius and courage. They join the ranks of just seven prior American astronauts who have made the perilous maiden voyage to test a new class of spacecraft.

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Now, like our ancestors before us, we are venturing out to explore a new, magnificent frontier. It's called: space. Our most daring feats, our most epic journeys, our biggest adventures, and our finest days are just beginning. America's proudest moments are still ahead. We are on the verge of our most exciting years, and next year may be the most exciting of all. You just watch.

So today, as our brave American astronauts shake the Earth and blaze a trail of fire and steel into the heavens, we proclaim for all to hear that we have not yet tested the full strength of the American character, and the world has not yet seen the full glory of the American spirit. For our country, for our children, and for humanity's march into the stars, the best is yet to come."



The Biden-Schumer-Pelosi Machine: The First Year

Every time some supposed conservative or Republican explains why he or she can't be for President Trump, I wonder if they have thought about the alternative — the Biden-Schumer-Pelosi machine.

Our choice this fall is not between President Trump and President Perfection. It is between President Trump and a nightmare which would end America as we have known it.

If Biden wins, it means the turnout will be such that Pelosi remains speaker, and the Democrats will almost certainly gain control of the Senate.

Given control of all three instruments of power, what will the Biden-Schumer-Pelosi team do?

This is not a question which requires wild speculation. As I outlined in a series of podcasts at Gingrich 360, the Pelosi \$3 trillion bill by itself contains enough radicalism to be terrifying. It would legalize all people currently in the country illegally. It would block federal immigration officers from deporting even criminals and gang members. It would give major Democratic donors a huge tax break by reestablishing unlimited deductibility for state and local taxes. It would pay for abortion with taxpayer money. It would release prisoners indiscriminately, so that at least six of the most infamous serial killers would be eligible for release. It would pour money into corrupt local governments and bail out the most wasteful states in America. These are just some examples from the bills more than 1,800 pages.

And there are plenty more examples. In my upcoming book Trump and the American Future, I detail a host of radical votes and actions which were supported by more than 200 currently serving House Democrats.

Beyond this, we have solid evidence from California, New York, and Virginia of how radical the Democrats will be if they control the House, Senate, and White House. Abortions – even after a baby is born – will be legalized and paid for with your tax money. Gun control will be effectively imposed by establishing manufacturer and gun seller liability for any gun used in a crime. (Trial lawyers would love it, and they are at the heart of the Democratic coalition.)

With HR1 (the first bill voted on this session) and the elections component of the Pelosi \$3 trillion bill, it is clear how the Democrats will move to make themselves unbeatable. They have been frustrated by free elections. Even when they could win the presidency, they only had unified power for two years at a time under Clinton and Obama. In both cases, they immediately lost the first off-year elections and then had to contend with Republican Houses.

That off-year victory led Clinton to compromise on welfare reform, balancing the budget, reforming the Food and Drug Administration and Federal Communications Commission, and cutting the capital gains tax. Liberals hated it and have never forgiven President Clinton for going to the center. President Obama was much more radical than President Clinton and had learned that the left would punish you for "selling out." His answer to Republican opposition was to accept limited legislative goals and try to change America through executive orders and radical appointees.

The current Democratic goal is to create a one-party government – as Democrats have in Chicago (the last Republican mayor served 89 years ago), New York (where Governor Cuomo dominates), and in California. Their election law changes will make it impossible to identify who is voting or have accurate voter rolls. It will set the stage for vote harvesting on a nationwide scale. All of this is clear from HR1 and the Pelosi Bill's provisions.

Faced with the Trump administration's extraordinary success in appointing more than 300 federal judges, the Biden-Schumer-Pelosi team will almost certainly invent hundreds of new federal judgeships, so they can fill them with radicals who will replace constitutional limits with politically correct rules. Unless Chief Justice John Roberts follows the election with a decisive shift to the left

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(certainly conceivable given some of his 5-4 votes with the liberal justices) it is likely the Biden-Schumer-Pelosi team will create four more seats for the US Supreme Court.

Trump's remarkable wave of deregulation will be reversed by Elizabeth Warren proteges appointed in every bureaucracy. Freedom will again be replaced with the rule of Washington.

Expect virtually every significant Trump executive order to be repealed in the first 90 days. Every liberal think tank and activist group is building a list of executive orders to be repealed, and my guess is that Obama administration alumni who have drafted executive orders in the past will actually have the draft orders completed by a potential Biden inaugural.

The economic recovery will come to an abrupt halt as the wave of red tape is matched by massive tax increases on investors and American business. Meanwhile, small businesses will simply drown. The unemployment rate will remain much higher than it would in a Trump administration, and the left's efforts to create a society in which the largest possible number of Americans is dependent on government for money, food, housing, and daily life will grow even bolder.

Police (if they survive at all) will face dramatically limited funds, draconian anti-police regulations, and a profound number of criminals on the street via the elimination of bail. In one recent case in New York, a serial bank robber was arrested six times for robbing banks and released every time without bail. After the sixth arrest, he told a detective he couldn't believe they kept letting him out.

Sympathy for Seattle-style "free zones" of Antifa-led takeovers and secessionist movements will become the norm. In these areas, theft-based economies and might-makes-right will replace the rule of law.

American history will continue to be rewritten, and a major effort will be made to establish reparations for African Americans who were never slaves to be paid by people who were never slaveowners. These payers would include the descendants of immigrants who came after the end of slavery.

In foreign policy, the Biden-Schumer-Pelosi team will revert immediately to a more leftwing version of Obama's policies. The Iran agreement will be renewed. The United States will rejoin the Paris Accord on Climate Change — and will meet its full funding obligation to the World Health Organization. Israel will be pressured to give up its new settlements and to find a deal with Hamas or face dramatic cuts in support from the United States. The Biden

administration will seek a new understanding with China, including the acceptance of the Hong Kong takeover and abysmal human rights abuses against Uyghurs in Xinjiang, a withdrawal from challenging China in the South China Sea, and a signal that pro-Chinese government appointees will be made to key positions at the National Security Council, State Department, and Commerce Department.

None of these examples are partisan exaggerations. They can all be found in bills, speeches, and articles by leading Democrats.

The next time someone suggests President Trump should not be re-elected, ask them if they have thought through what life will be like under a Biden-Schumer-Pelosi machine.

“You Won’t Need to Abolish Us – We Won’t be Around For it”

The nasty words we, the police, get called all the time have now turned into rocks, bottles and gunfire. It's over, America: we are leaving.

This is the hardest thing I have written.

I grew up in a law enforcement family. My father worked his way up to the rank of Captain at the Fort Smith, Arkansas, Police Department. As a kid I remember going with him on Friday to pick up his check and I was in awe of these super heroes he worked around.

My dad sacrificed a lot and so did my late mother. Whether it was the week-long surveillance or wiretap or chasing drug runners across the country, he gave it all for my family and worked plenty of extra details to never let our family be without. Some would call that privilege but where I grew up, it was called hard work.

The kids at school thought it was cool what my dad did and while he sometimes asked me if anyone gave me a hard time, they never did. There was respect among all... even the kids in shop class.

I didn't grow up wanting to be a cop but one fateful night, as a freshman in college, that all changed.

I went on a ride along and my life's journey would never be the same.

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After four years of college my dad wanted me at an agency that respected that education so I moved to Tulsa (Oklahoma) at 21 years old and never looked back.

I didn't know anyone and all I knew was what I saw my dad do, work hard and treat people with respect. I saw a lot of other cops working hard as well and doing all they could to keep the community safe.

27 years has passed and if you would have told me the condition of law enforcement today, I would have never believed you.

It's not that law enforcement has changed for the worse but everything around it has.

The mentally ill used to get treatment and now they just send cops. Kids used to be taught respect and now it's cool to be disrespectful.

Supervisors used to back you when you were right but now they accuse you of being wrong in order to appease crazy people.

Parents used to get mad at their kids for getting arrested and now they get mad at us.

The media used to highlight the positive contribution our profession gave to society and now they either ignore it or twist the truth for controversy to line their own pockets.

There used to be a common respect among criminals. If they got caught, they understood you had a job to do but now it's our fault they sit in handcuffs rather than their own personal decisions.

If someone attacked a cop, they were seen as such. Now we martyr them and sue for millions.

We used to be able to testify in court and we were believed. Now, unless there is video from three different angles, no one cares what you have to say.

With all this talk about racism and racist cops, I've never seen people treated differently because of their race. And while I know that cowards that have never done this job will call me racist for saying it, all I've ever seen was criminal behavior and cops trying to stop it and they didn't give a rip what their skin color was.

I've seen cops help and save any type of race, gender or ethnicity you can think of and while that used to mean something, no one cares anymore.

I've been called every name you can think of and many of them with racial overtones and it's never come from cops. I've watched African American cops take the brunt of this and even talked one rookie out of quitting after he was berated by a lot of cowards that had the same skin color as him.

I've heard words I never heard before being a cop.

Uncle Tom, Cracker, Pig and the N Word just to name a few. I've heard them thousands of times and never once did I see a police officer retaliate.

They just took it.

Despite that, it's been the greatest opportunity of my life to do this job. I would have recommended it to anyone and I secretly hoped one of my kids would do it one day.

They would have been a 4th Generation Cop.

But today, all of that is over. I wouldn't wish this job on my worst enemy. I would never send anyone I cared about into the hell that this profession has become.

It's the only job you can do everything right and lose everything.

It's the only job where the same citizens you risk your life for hate you for it.

It's the only segment left in society where it's cool to discriminate and judge, just because of the uniform you wear.

You never get to explain.

You can never reason with them.

The nasty words have now turned into rocks and bottles and gunfire.

I've watched it happen to those around me and I have seen the total destruction of their life.

This job is a walking time bomb and you could get cancelled or prosecuted on the very next call, even if you do everything right.

No profession has to deal with that.

Doctors kill 250,000 people a year. They call them "*medical mistakes*" because society understands that they do a very difficult job under high stress and they must make the best possible decision in the moment.

Law enforcement is tasked with the same and we are highly successful. Despite the most violent society we have ever seen, less than 1,000 suspects are killed a year. 96% are attacking us with weapons and all but a few others are attacking us with their cars or their fists and more and more with simulated guns so Benjamin Crump (an American civil rights attorney) can help their family win the lottery.

I've seen cops risk their own lives when they shouldn't have... just to keep from taking one.

They never get the credit that other professions get.

Cowards are all around us. From chiefs to sheriffs to politicians, no one has our back.

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Now, the little we have, we are told they are going to defund us or even abolish us. Citizens with a political agenda will reign over us and all you have to do is wake up and put on a uniform to be a racist.

This weekend I received death threats for just doing my job. It would have been outrageous a decade ago and made national news.

Now, it's just a Monday.

There will be more threats, more accusations of racism and more lies told about us.

I used to talk cops out of leaving the job. Now I'm encouraging them.

It's over America. You finally did it.

You aren't going to have to abolish the police, we won't be around for it.

And while I know most Americans still appreciate us, it's not enough and the risk is too high.

Those of you that say thank you or buy the occasional meal, it means everything.

But those of you that were silent while the slow turning of the knives in our backs happened by thugs and cowards, this is on you.

Your belief in hashtags and memes over the truth has and will create an environment in your community that you will never expect.

If you think Minneapolis will never turn into Mogadishu – it's coming.

And when it does, remember what your complicity did.

This is the America that you made.

Boston Considers Removing Statue of Abraham Lincoln

Boston's mayor is in favor of taking down a local statue of President Abraham Lincoln standing before a freed black man, after a petition was launched for its removal, his office says.

Mayor Marty Walsh's office added that the pol wants a community discussion about its future and whether a new statue commemorating the end of slavery should be commissioned to take its place, according to the Boston Globe.

The controversial statue, situated in the city's Park Square, is a replica of the Emancipation Memorial in Washington and shows Lincoln with one hand raised above a kneeling man with broken shackles on his wrists.

The monument was intended to show Lincoln freeing the man from slavery, but a new petition argues that it "instead represents us still beneath someone else.

"It says that it's a statue that's supposed to represent freedom. But, to me, it represents submissiveness," said Tory Bullock, who started the online petition, which had more than 8,300 signatures as of Monday.

"It represents 'Know your place, because that's where you belong.'" Bullock said he'd like to see the statue replaced with a new one that symbolizes equality.

"This is a great opportunity to get some local black artists involved in the creation of (a new) statue, to come up with something new that represents equality," Bullock told WCVB-TV.

The calls to dismantle the statue come after a Christopher Columbus statue was beheaded last week in the North End neighborhood amid protests over the death of George Floyd. Other controversial monuments have also been destroyed in recent days.
